## Adult Sunday School ~ Next Sunday ~ 9:30-10:30 a.m.

**FINCH (Families in Christ), Room 203:** This class brings together parents and other adults to learn and grow in their own faith and their ability to share that faith with their families.

**Kerygma Study of One in Christ, Room 232:** This semester we will study First Corinthians, learning from the writer, Paul, how to “walk the talk.” We will discover how having the mind of Christ affects the way we live.
