KNOW

Adult Sunday School ~ Next Sunday ~ 9:30-10:30 a.m.

FINCH (Families in Christ), Room 203: This class brings together parents and other adults to learn and grow in their own faith and their ability to share that faith with their families.

Kerygma Study of One in Christ, Room 232: This semester we will study First Corinthians, learning from the writer, Paul, how to “walk the talk.” We will discover how having the mind of Christ affects the way we live.

The Present Word, Room 145, Parlor: This class is for all levels of biblical knowledge as a traditional Bible study. Next week’s lesson is “God’s Promises Fulfilled.” (Joshua 1:1b-6; 11:16-10, 21-23)

Seasons of the Spirit, Room 235: This discussion class is biblically-based, following revised common Lectionary. Jesus promises that the Spirit will continue to shape the disciples as the Body of Christ. (Acts 1:6-14)

Soul Food (Finding Sustenance for Faithful Living), Room 234: Fellowship, study and discussion on a range of topics related to spirituality in our lives. “The Thoughtful Christian” curriculum provides much of the source material for this class.

Adult Summer School Begins Next Sunday, June 5! Summer is fast approaching! When summer comes, we like to shake things up a bit with Adult Sunday School. Sunday School doesn’t take a vacation, but it does change a little so that you can always feel free to attend a class even if you have been on vacation.

After discussion at its stated meeting on Sunday, May 15th, the St. Luke's Session has adopted the following response to the recent changes to the Presbyterian Church (USA) Constitution regarding standards for ordination:

"The Session of St. Luke's Presbyterian Church acknowledges the many and varied perspectives and emotions in our Denomination, our Church, and our Session regarding the recent passage of Amendment 10A. We commit to continued love and mutual forbearance in the midst of our differences as we strive, with God's help, to joyfully fulfill our St. Luke's mission and vision as the Body of Christ here in Dunwoody and within the PC (USA)."

The Session will continue to prayerfully consider the constitutional change, and will provide future communications as warranted. If you have questions and/or concerns about these matters, please feel free to speak with any of our pastors or elders.
