Adult Summer School in Full Swing! Sunday School doesn't take a vacation, but it does change a little so that you can always feel free to attend a class even if you have been on vacation.

For the entire summer:

Seasons of the Spirit, Room 235: This discussion class is biblically-based, following revised common Lectionary. As God has loved and welcomed us, so are we called to embrace a life of hospitality. (Mathew 10:40-42)

"**Summer Elective**" course, which this year gets back to basics with a study of the **Ten Commandments** and what they mean for us today. And we are excited to say that our Stephen Ministers will lead a short course on Christian Care Giving - exact dates are on the way!

Understanding that folks travel and are in and out more than usual in the summer, ALL of the summer classes are designed for you to be able to "come when you can" and not worry that you will be out of the loop.
