Another 25% will go to the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta who have supported Habitat for Humanity Interfaith home construction, supported Reverends Shelvis and Nancy Smith-Mather in their ministry of reconciliation in South Sudan, and offered scholarships to seminarians enabling them to attend Peacemaking programs.
